Fondazione Tor Vergata is pleased to announce the XXXVI edition of the Villa Mondragone International Economic Seminar on “*Global Imbalances and Geopolitical Changes*”.

This year’s edition will explore the profound transformations shaping the global political and economic landscape, with particular focus on how geopolitical tensions affect global trade, supply chains, and the international financial system. Key discussions will address the multiple dimensions of strategic autonomy and the economic policy responses required in an increasingly fragmented global order. The objective of the Seminar is to discuss a selected number of papers presented by prominent international scholars, providing original perspectives and valuable insights on the Seminar’s theme.

In this context, we are organizing an **augmented poster session dedicated to young scholars interested in presenting their work at this prestigious event**. The poster session is designed to provide young researchers with greater visibility and an opportunity to receive constructive feedback on their work.

We particularly encourage submissions from PhD students whose research broadly aligns with the Seminar’s theme. All Seminar participants will be invited to interact with poster presenters.

Based on an assessment of the submitted papers, the Organising Committee will award **the Villa Mondragone Young Scholars Prize**, of €2.000, to the most outstanding paper.

Eligibility

In line with the initiative’s objectives, applications may be submitted by PhD students enrolled in economics programmes and by candidates who obtained their PhD no earlier than 2024.

At the time of application, candidates must have a draft or a paper ready for submission and, if selected, must provide a poster in electronic format for the session. They must also attend the seminar to present their work.

Applications must be submitted by **May 31, 2026**, by emailing the file in PDF format to the Scientific Organizing Committee: mondragoneassociation@gmail.com.
